About this piece's design


Prior its 2022 redesign, Lehigh's Campus Guide and Walking Tour was a large, single sheet map (that folded down to a handy 5 * 7 inches), which showed visitors the easiest path to access Lehigh's most iconic buildings.

The 2022 reincarnation was designed to do more. Some key updates made were:


- the addition of ADA-accessible walking routes—an important feature for a campus with as many stairs as Lehigh's!
- reimagining the piece's form to create something that visitors would find convenient to carry and use as they navigate campus.
- the inclusion of images that show life inside each of the buildings—as visitors have limited access to Lehigh's buildings.
- the addition of QR codes which lead to the Campus Guide's companion piece: this audio guide.

Alumni Memorial Building


Built in memory of alumni who fought in WWI, the Alumni Memorial Building is home to



One of the most impressive libraries in the nation according to *Architectural Digest*, Linderman


is a state-of-the-art center for the humanities, and is home to Lucy's Cafe, a favorite hangout among students.

Packard Laboratory is the headquarters of the P.C. Rossin College of Engineering and


Applied Science. It features Old No. 1, the original Packard automobile, generously donated by Lehigh alumnus James Packard.







Murray H. **Goodman Campus**



Driving to Mountaintop Campus

M 111 Research Drive Bethlehem, PA 18015

Turn left onto Brodhead Avenue. The road will bear left and become University Drive.

At the second stop sign, turn right onto Sayre Drive, and at the next stop sign, turn right to stay on Sayre Drive. Bear left onto Lower Sayre Park Road. Continue as the road winds up the mountain.

At the stop sign, make a right onto Mountain Drive. When you come to a "Y," bear left (Mountain Drive South).

At the next "Y," bear left to enter Lehigh's Mountaintop Campus. lacocca Hall is straight ahead; visitor parking is to the right before the building.

Driving to Murray H. Goodman Campus



Follow the directions to Lehigh's Mountaintop Campus. However, at the second "Y" on Mountain Drive, bear right (passing Lehigh's Mountaintop Campus to your left).

Follow the brown signs for Goodman Campus Stadium/ Arena and Stadium Parking.

Go through the stop sign and make the second left onto Goodman Drive. Stabler Arena will be on your right; Goodman Stadium will be on your left.
