Asa Packer Campus — Walking Tour





1 Alumni Memorial Building

Built in memory of alumni who fought in WWI, the Alumni Memorial Building is home to

the Office of Admissions and the offices of the President; Provost; Financial Aid; Bursar; Diversity, Inclusion & Equity; and Registration & Academic Services.

Clayton University Center at Packer Hall (UC) & the UC Front Lawn

The Clayton UC is the hub of campus activity and home to student and faculty dining facilities, a food court, a bank and several student affairs offices.

6 Centennial II Complex

The Centennial II Complex comprises six individual residence halls. Each of the residence halls

on the Asa Packer Campus is unique, but they all surround the academic core of the campus and offer a short walk to classes, the libraries and all on-campus activities.

7 Zoellner Arts Center

This premier performing arts center showcases world-class acts and three theaters—the 1,000-

seat Baker Hall, the Diamond Theater and the Fowler Black Box Theatre. Zoellner is home to Lehigh's music and theatre departments and two of the eight on-campus LU Art Galleries.





8 Rauch Business Center

Rauch Business Center is home to the College of Business and houses state-of-the-art classrooms and

auditoriums, the "Common Grounds" eatery, the Financial Services Lab, Lehigh's MBA program and the Clayton Conference Center.

Rauch's open and sunny atrium provides the perfect spot for students to meet up, study and engage in business discussions.






9 Wilbur Powerhouse

10 Health, Science & Technology Building (HST)

Home to Lehigh's College of Health, this brand-new building features

open-concept labs, transparent walls, integrated workspaces and a community forum, laid out in a way that prompts unexpected meetings among students and colleagues.





▲ Wilbur's Additive Manufacturing Lab is a teaching, learning and research lab that embraces the use and implementation of all types of 3D printing.

> The Computing Lab, aka "The Bridge," is popular with students of all majors, especially those in the intercollegiate interdisciplinary programs: Computer Science and Business (CSB), Integrated Business and Engineering (IBE) and the Integrated Degree in Engineering, Arts and Sciences (IDEAS).







▲ HST's open, shared labs allow teams of faculty and students from across disciplines to work side by side and put research on display, inviting inquiry.

Cutting-edge technology is integrated into the entire HST building, including interactive screens and modular designs.







11 Farrington Square

Lehigh's gateway to South Bethlehem, Farrington Square is a modern residential complex, as

well as home to the University Bookstore, several eateries and the Bethlehem Farmers' Market.





12 Maginnes Hall

Maginnes Hall is home to the College of Arts and Sciences, and features many classrooms

and computing spaces, as well as our Center for Career and Professional Development (CCPD), which provides robust support to the entire student body.





Students love the Bethlehem Farmers' Market, which takes place each Thursday from May-October, and features produce, floral, lunch and specialty vendors.



The University Bookstore features a Starbucks cafe, school supplies, books and brown and white gear.





Lehigh's 9:1 student-tofaculty ratio allows for small class sizes, engaging classroom discussions and personal attention.



The CCPD supports students through their time at Lehigh and beyond. Over the last two decades, approximately 96% of graduates were employed, continuing education or pursuing military or volunteer service within six months of graduation.

13 STEPS

A Gold-status LEED-certified facility, STEPS stands for Science, Technology, Environment, Policy & Society. The

building features an open design facilitating interdisciplinary work across the departments housed within it, as well as our intercollegiate interdisciplinary programs.

Packard Laboratory is the headquarters of the P.C. Rossin College of Engineering and


Applied Science. It features Old No. 1, the original Packard automobile, generously donated by Lehigh alumnus James Packard.

Mountaintop Campus

Murray H. **Goodman Campus**



Driving to Mountaintop Campus

111 Research Drive Bethlehem, PA 18015 M

Turn left onto Brodhead Avenue. The road will bear left and become University Drive.

At the second stop sign, turn right onto Sayre Drive, and at the next stop sign, turn right to stay on Sayre Drive. Bear left onto Lower Sayre Park Road. Continue as the road winds up the mountain.

At the stop sign, make a right onto Mountain Drive. When vou come to a "Y." bear left (Mountain Drive South).

At the next "Y." bear left to enter Lehigh's Mountaintop Campus. lacocca Hall is straight ahead; visitor parking is to the right before the building.

Driving to Murray H. Goodman Campus

151 Goodman Drive Bethlehem, PA 18015 G

Follow the directions to Lehigh's Mountaintop Campus. However, at the second "Y" on Mountain Drive, bear right (passing Lehigh's Mountaintop Campus to your left).

Follow the brown signs for Goodman Campus Stadium/ Arena and Stadium Parking.

Go through the stop sign and make the second left onto Goodman Drive. Stabler Arena will be on your right; Goodman Stadium will be on your left.
