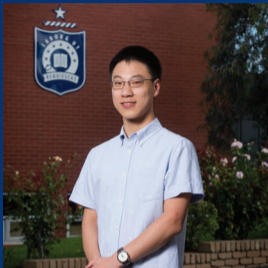
Youssef Sabet — Class of 2015
